As many of you know, I have been writing a book called, "Winging It," that talks about my life story, and the relationship between suffering and hope (with more of afn emphasis on hope). It is in part based on a favorite Scripture of mine: "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. The will soar up on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary; walk and not be faint" (Isaiah 40:31), but Friday night as I was again feeling horrible and about to be admitted to the hospital once again, I thought of a similar verse found in the Psalms, "He shall cover you with His feathers, And under His wings you shall take refuge; His Truth shall be your shield and buckler" (Ps. 91:4). I was sharing my story with a nurse in the emergency department, and I said the one reason I was grateful for my struggles was because it had kept me close to God, in that when I feel crummy I just surround myself in the protection and comfort of His wings. It's a special place to be. I find myself resting there, being still. It may be when I'm physically or emotionally unwell, but I still treasure this special place to rest. For that reason, I do not regret the struggles.
